Chairman's Report.

2009 turned out to be a very difficult year in many ways, from a test pass viewpoint it was disappointing with only 6 passes in the year a large reduction on previous years.

We as your committee have looked deeply into this and some of the problem must be laid at the door of a high increase in the cost of taking the course, now standing at £139 against the serious effects of the financial downturn resulting in the average person having a much reduced amount of disposable income and therefore such bodies as ours have had to take a back seat until the situation begins to improve.

However towards the end of 2009 we were pleased to announce that the Derbyshire Road Safety Partnership were offering to assist Derbyshire motorcyclists in taking IAM training and testing, in the first instance this will offer 20 new associates the chance to complete the course for a much reduced fee and benefits from this scheme are already beginning to be apparent.

Like many other facets of today's society there is a demand to formalise systems, we as a club have

not missed out on this and we have to formalise the training of existing and new observers. This difficult task has been taken on by Tony Grimshaw and training sessions have already started with the first having taken place at Chaddesden fire station two weeks ago, my thanks go to Tony for taking on this onerous task and I wish him much success in the future.

The social side of the club, something which I value highly has been pretty successful with good attendance at the majority of monthly meetings and I thank the membership for that. Speakers have been difficult to find but we have managed a few with most recently Gordon May relating his adventures of riding to India from the UK on a 55 year old Royal Enfield. Efforts will continue to try to attract entertaining speakers for the future and any ideas from members are always very welcome.

At a recent committee meeting it was agreed and I was very pleased to offer honouree membership of the club to Pete and Kath Clarke and to Mike and Anita Sheehan.

Pete and Kath have worked tirelessly in the past to help with club funds by organising the monthly raffle , they

have decided to sell the bike but I sincerely hope that they will continue to come to club nights and hopefully organise a raffle still, it would not be the same without them.

Is Your Lovely Pillion Passenger Insured? (Are You Certain?)

I have been asked to remind you about an experience that I had last year when I re-insured my motorcycle with a really reputable firm. I discovered that without any specific warning my cover had been reduced where carrying a pillion passenger was concerned. The schedule actually stated that I would not be carrying one! I had never declared this and a comparison with previous years showed that this was a new exclusion. I checked with the firm who deleted the exclusion at no extra cost, but at the same time they told me that if I had actually had a spill whilst carrying a pillion, my insurance would have been reduced to third party. I think that this stinks. So much so that I moved this year to *Footman-James* and they offer a brilliant package that includes roadside recovery and all sorts of goodies. I wrote to the BMW Owner's Club letter page and other correspondents replied that this 'trick' was not unique. So, watch out!
